ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM COURT ORDER

On [date], the Court entered an Order requiring the Debtor to [*describe relevant requirement, e.g. “make plan payments to the Trustee on or before the last day of each month”; “provide the Trustee with copies of tax returns by a certain deadline”; “file a modified feasible plan by a certain deadline”*]. The Order contained a “doomsday provision” allowing the Trustee to file an Affidavit of Default and a proposed Order Dismissing Case in the event the Debtor failed to comply with the requirement by the deadline.

The Debtor filed a Motion for relief from the Order, requesting additional time to comply with the Order. No objections to the Motion were filed. Accordingly,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED: the deadline for the Debtor to [*describe requirement*] is extended through and including [date].

[*Or, if more applicable*]

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED: the doomsday period is extended through and including [date]. Should the Debtor fail to mail the equivalent of one monthly payment through and including [date], the Trustee may submit an Affidavit of Default and a proposed Order Dismissing Case.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: all other terms and conditions of the original Order remain in full force and effect.
